Whitetail Golf Club

Hole one – Par 3	Blue 172	White 146	Red 126	Yellow 138

Whitetail's mid-length par 3 opening hole should provide a straightforward start to your round. Solid shots will avoid the pond in front of the tee and two bunkers surrounding this large flat green will give you a reasonable chance at a par.

<u>Hole two – Par 5</u> Blue 577 White 523 Red 406 Yellow 411

This beautiful par 5 gives players a good chance to shoot par or better. Waste bunkers lining both sides of the narrow fairway can be avoided with a straight shot off the tee. A solid second shot will put you in position for an easy approach to the elevated green.

Hole three – Par 4 Blue 392 White 367 Red 308 Yellow 313

Although visually intimidating from the tee, there is plenty of room to the right. The creek crossing the fairway beyond the 100 yard marker, two bunkers guarding the green, and a drop off to the right help make this one of the toughest holes on the front nine.

Hole four – Par 4 Blue 406 White 382 Red 297 Yellow 365

A mid-length par 4 from an elevated tee is generous in width. A creek crossing the fairway beyond the 100 yard marker and two greenside bunkers add challenge to this hole.

<u>Hole five – Par 4</u> Blue 396 White 388 Red 277 Yellow 285

Environmentally sensitive area (that is not to be entered) along the left side and stretching into the fairway short of the green. Hit your tee shot to the right side of the fairway as it slopes to the left. A good second shot will carry the hazard and land on this small turtle back shaped green.

<u>Hole six – Par 4</u> Blue 294 White 276 Red 249 Yellow 262

Though tempting to drive it to the bottom of the hill short of the green, the easier play is to land in the fairway between the 100 and 150 yard markers. With severe slopes surrounding this green, care should be taken not to miss anywhere but short.

Hole seven – Par 5 Blue 555 White 508 Red 436 Yellow 441

This is a long narrow par 5 that sweeps around to the right. A solid tee shot towards the left side of the fairway will give the best angle for your second shot. Stay below the hole whenever possible as the green is sloped from back to front.

Hole eight – Par 3 Blue 173 White 154 Red 140 Yellow 147

This downhill par 3 provides challenge for all levels of golfers. Avoid a long shot as the greenside bunkers and surroundings slope away from the green and make for a difficult chip shot.

Hole nine – Par 4 Blue 405 White 360 Red 337 Yellow 348

Dense forest protects the left hand side of this uphill dogleg left par 4. A large Oak tree on the left side of the fairway can make for a difficult second shot. Aim towards the fairway bunker on the right to have the best angle to the green.

Hole ten - Par 4Blue 362White 340Red 290Yellow 329

This award winning hole is the pride of Whitetail. A carefully placed tee shot just beyond the 150 yard marker will keep you short of the two fairway ponds. The greenside bunkers and trees guarding the long narrow green demand a precise approach shot if trouble is to be avoided.

Hole eleven – Par 3 Blue 143 White 133 Red 123 Yellow 128

This short downhill par 3 can provide a good chance at birdie. Be conscious of the elevation change, as it is difficult to achieve success from behind the green.

Hole twelve – Par 4 Blue 335 White 319 Red 215 Yellow 305

A grouping of trees in the right rough is the challenge from the tee on this short par 4. Do your best to keep your ball below the hole on this sloping green.

Hole thirteen – Par 4 Blue 296 White 288 Red 197 Yellow 215

Stronger players can reach this short par 4 from the tee. Trouble surrounds this small, sloping green, with two bunkers fronting on the left and right. Stay below the hole on your approach.

Hole fourteen – Par 4 Blue 311 White 301 Red 227 Yellow 295

A tee shot struck down the left hand side will run aggressively into the centre of the fairway. Avoid going beyond the 100 yard marker with your tee shot and you will be left with an easier approach shot to a sloping green fronted by water. Ring the bell before proceeding to the green.

Hole fifteen – Par 4 Blue 395 White 375 Red 329 Yellow 340

An intimidating tee shot must avoid trees to the left and wetlands to the right on this demanding par 4. Be aware of the pin's location on this long, narrow green, protected by bunkers to the left yet open to the right.

Hole sixteen – Par 5 Blue 600 White 582 Red 458 Yellow 465

This 600 yard-par 5 is ranked the hardest hole on the course. Aim your tee shot to the right side of the fairway to avoid the grassy slopes on the left side. A good second shot will take you down the hill to the 150 yard marker in order to reach the green in three shots.

Hole seventeen – Par 3 Blue 188 White 174 Red 140 Yellow 167

This long, beautiful, downhill par 3 takes you across a large pond to a very large green guarded by bunkers. A good solid tee shot is required to carry the pond. Par is a great score on this tough hole.

Hole eighteen – Par 5 Blue 496 White 484 Red 349 Yellow 355

A pond on the right and forest on the left frames the landing area from the tee. Two good shots will prepare you for a 100 yard third shot to a shallow angled green.
